Ames Laboratory Former Workers

Population Being Served

Ames Laboratory is located in Ames, Iowa, on the Iowa State University campus. This facility was established in 1947 by the Atomic Energy Commission to create high-purity uranium for the Manhattan Project during World War II. Throughout this time, Ames produced more than 1,000 tons of uranium, some of which is still used today. These workers conducted research in the chemical, materials, engineering, environmental, and physical sciences.

Organization Providing Services

The medical monitoring of these workers will be carried out by the University of Iowa, School of Public Health, which currently provides medical screening at the Iowa Army Ammunition Plant located in Middletown, Iowa.

Current Status of the Program

Medical monitoring of former workers at the Ames National Laboratory began in 2006 and is ongoing.
