Kansas City Plant Former Workers

Population Being Served

The Kansas City Plant, located in Kansas City, Missouri, was established in 1949 to build non-nuclear components for nuclear weapons for the Atomic Energy Commission. This facility procures electric, electronic, electromechanical, mechanical, plastic, and non-fissionable metal components. The plant is also involved in environmental clean up efforts. Medical screening is provided to former workers from this site in two separate groups based on the type of work they performed, production or construction.

Organizations Providing Services

Former Production Workers – This project is conducted by Oak Ridge Associated Universities in partnership with Comprehensive Health Services, National Jewish Medical and Research Center, and Occupational HealthLink as part of the National Supplemental Screening Program.

Former Construction Workers – This project is conducted by the Center to Protect Workers' Rights, an applied occupational health research and development center of the Building and Construction Trades Department of the AFL-CIO, in partnership with Duke University Medical Center, University of Cincinnati Medical Center, and Zenith Administrators.

Current Status of the Program

Programs to serve both the former production and construction workers began in 2006 and are ongoing.
