Population Being Served

Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) was founded in 1943 in Los Alamos, New Mexico, to design and build an atomic bomb. The work of the laboratory culminated in the creation of the bombs used at Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan. LANL also created the first hydrogen bomb. LANL is one of the largest multidisciplinary science institutions in the world and is operated by the University of California for the National Nuclear Security Administration. Currently, Los Alamos' nuclear work is related to computer simulations and stockpile stewardship.

This project is led by the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health, in partnership with the University of New Mexico.

Current Status of the Program

This program was initiated in 1997 and is ongoing.
