Population Being Served

The Sandia National Laboratory (SNL), located in Livermore, California, was established in 1956 as one of three DOE Defense Program laboratories (Los Alamos and Lawrence Livermore are the others). Sandia's original purpose was ordnance engineering and turning the nuclear physics packages created at the other laboratories into deployable weapons. Sandia has also been involved in stockpile surveillance and applied research activities for nuclear weapons. Sandia's current mission is to develop, engineer, and test the non-nuclear components of nuclear weapons.

Organizations Providing Services

Medical screening for former workers at the Sandia National Laboratory in Livermore, California, is being conducted by Boston University and the University of California at San Francisco.
