Dear General Clarkson:

I received your letter of 26 May 1992 and am glad to tell you that I have also been thinking of the desirability of supplementing the Emirotok facilities with those of a neighboring atoll. In particular, I have been considering Bikini Atoll.

I have not considered Ujalaq, even though it is closer to Emirotok, because the available land area in that atoll seems insufficient to me to warrant its development even though it could conceivably be sufficient for a portion of Operation Castle.

It is clear that [REDACTED] on Emirotok would again require evacuation of that atoll, however, my reasons for looking at Bikini as an operational site are not so much based on logistic worries as on the following considerations: First, it is quite possible that radiological conditions may render Emirotok unsuitable for Operation Castle and we will not know until some months after Operation Ivy; second, Operation Castle may involve as many as three shots of the order of 50 RT in addition to a larger shot and available target areas on Emirotok are not suitable for such a program; third, the atoll of Emirotok represents an important asset to the AEC and to the country and we will risk its loss to us if we continue to use up its real estate for tests such as [REDACTED].
[REDACTED] fourth, the thermonuclear program may easily dictate a greater frequency of diagnostic shots than can be accommodated by the Emirotok real estate.

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I am sure you recognize that my such plan will alleviate some logistic problems by creating new ones. It is not clear to me at this time whether the overall task will be simplified or complicated. Maintenance facilities for large aircraft do not exist on Emirotok; parking space for such planes is minimal and may be insufficient; housing and utilities

will impose a limitation on the population of Bikini that may be unacceptable; liaison service between stables by C-45's, C-47's, DC-3's and alike, as well as by ship, will be required; intra-stable service by DC-3's or similar planes and small boats will be required; ships will be required at both locations; communications must be provided; even with this, we will require a capability for emergency evacuation.

However, I believe a study of such a plan is warranted. I have discussed this problem with Tyler and Bradbury and both have concurred in my getting wheels in motion to determine the problems involved in such a plan.

I have asked Paul Spain to send an initial reconnaissance party of Holmes and Harver personnel to Bikini to determine what work would be required to make Bikini available to us for Operation Castle, and to provide a basis for a preliminary cost estimate for that work. I propose to ask Mr. Purvis to prepare a tentative operation plan on the basis of Bikini Atoll as the site for the large shot and Eniwetok as a base of operations as well as the site for any smaller shots. I also propose to discuss the Rad-Safe problem with Ross Maynard when I see him next week. It is clear that after Operation Ivy our knowledge of radiological hazards will be greater and many of our questions on this score should be answered.


I will keep you informed of developments in this connection as they occur.
