I am enclosing a letter written by Thomas N. White to Mr. Allen Brodsky, of the Nucleonics Division of the Naval Research Laboratory, giving the radiation exposure figures for Naval Research Laboratory personnel on Operation Greenhouse.

It is requested that you consider this letter and if you deem it advisable, forward it. I should like to call your attention to the problem illustrated by this letter which may become serious after the dissolution of Joint Task Force Three. The Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory was not responsible for measurement of exposures, nor is it responsible for maintenance of such records. In the present case we have no information on five individuals. Since their exposures may have been recorded with some other part of Joint Task Force Three, we have no proof that they were not exposed. I anticipate similar difficulties with similar requests in the future and suggest that you consult with the Joint Task Force and find out to what agency such requests for information can be referred after Joint Task Force Three has been dissolved.
