

Dear Mr. Strauss:

Recently I received a letter from Dr. R. H. Walker, Dean and Director of the Agricultural Experiment Station at the Utah State Agricultural College Logan, Utah. In this letter Dr. Walker advised me that the Atomic Energy Commission had notified him that an allocation of \$25,000.00 would be made to Utah State Agricultural College for the purpose of conducting research to determine the cause of sheep losses which occurred in Utah last year and which were first attributed to radiation fall out.

Inasmuch as this money apparently has not as yet been made available, could you advise me as to the exact date these funds will be allocated so that the school might commence its investigation work of these sheep losses. Also, since livestock will shortly be placed on the summer ranges, it is highly desirable that these studies be completed at as early a date as possible.
