Iowa Army Ammunition Plant Former Workers

Population Being Served

The Iowa Army Ammunition Plant (IAAP) was established in Middletown, Iowa, in 1941. Its principal mission was to load, assemble, and pack a variety of conventional ammunitions and fusing systems for the U.S. Department of Defense. Between 1947 and 1975, IAAP was involved in weapons assembly and manufacturing for the Atomic Energy Commission. IAAP is currently involved in various clean up efforts. The facility was listed on the Superfund National Priorities List in 1990.

Organization Providing Services

The Burlington Atomic Energy Commission Plant--Former Worker Program is conducted by the University of Iowa, School of Public Health. The program screens individuals who worked for the Atomic Energy Commission in atomic weapons manufacturing anytime between 1947 and 1975.

Current Status of the Program

This project began in 2000 and is ongoing.
