National Supplemental Screening Program

Population Being Served

The National Supplemental Screening Program (NSSP) was established in 2005 to provide medical screening to former DOE workers from anywhere in the U.S. who cannot be served by the other site-specific Former Worker Programs because of distance. Participants are generally referred to the NSSP by the screening program associated with their former site, which provides information to the NSSP on potential exposures and appropriate associated screening protocols for each individual.

Organizations Providing Services

This screening program is conducted by the Oak Ridge Associated Universities in conjunction with its partners Comprehensive Health Services, National Jewish Medical and Research Center, and Occupational HealthLink.

Current Status of the Program

This program began screening in 2005 and is ongoing.
